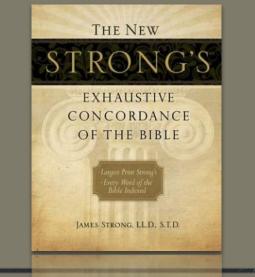

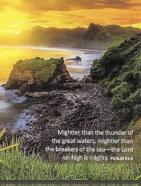

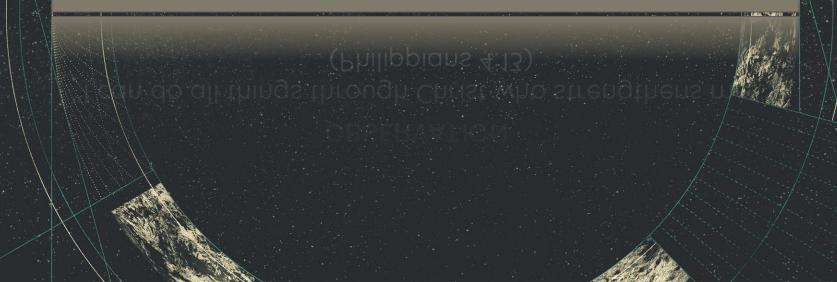

OBSERVATION

"I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me." (Philippians 4:13)



OBSERVATION

"Therefore, my brothers and sisters, you whom I love and long for, my joy and crown, stand firm in the Lord this way, dear friends." (Philippians 4:1)

Ask: What way? **Note**: Therefore is a transition word... Go back to 3:20, 21

OBSERVATION

"But our citizenship is in heaven. And we eagerly await a Savior from there, the Lord Jesus Christ, who, by the power that enables him to bring everything under his control, will transform our lowly bodies so that they will be like his glorious body." (Philippians 3:20, 21)

OBSERVATION

"Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again... Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." (Philippians 4:4-7)

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OBSERVATION

"I have learned to be content whatever the circumstances. I know what it is to be in need, and I know what it is to have plenty. I have learned the secret of being content in any and every situation, whether well fed or hungry, whether living in plenty or in want." (Philippians 4:11, 12)

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OBSERVATION

"I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me." (Philippians 4:13)

INTERPRETATION: QUESTIONS TO ASK

Wouldn't I be anxious in jail? Why is Paul telling them to rejoice and be thankful? How is it that Paul is at peace? What is his secret for being content?

A: His hope and strength comes from trusting Christ.

APPLICATION

In times of trial, stress, burden, I can:
1. Rejoice in my salvation (3:20, 21)
2. Experience peace through prayer (4:6, 7)
3. Learn to be content in Christ (4:11, 12)
